"Wild Spirit"



Dear Friends,

Have you ever tried to catch the wind? This morning, watching my wind chimes dance wildly in the breeze, I was reminded that the Spirit is equally uncatchable. We can hear it, feel its effects, see the evidence of its movement – but we can never quite pin it down or predict where it will blow next.

As we approach Pentecost on May 24th, I'm struck by how often we try to tame what God intended to be wild. We like our faith orderly, predictable, manageable. We create programs, schedules, and committees (and trust me, as a United Methodist, I appreciate good organization!). But the Holy Spirit seems to have a different approach entirely.

Look at what happened on that first Pentecost in Acts 2: "Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them." There's nothing tidy about violent wind and fire. The bystanders didn't know what to make of it – some thought the disciples were drunk! The Spirit showed up in a way nobody expected and turned everything upside down.

I think about the sci-fi fans among us (myself included) who know the famous line from Jurassic Park: "Life finds a way." The Holy Spirit is a bit like that – always finding a way through our carefully constructed barriers, our comfortable routines, our neatly boxed-in expectations of how God should work.

Jesus himself told Nicodemus, "The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit" (John 3:8). Even Jesus used the untamable nature of wind to describe the Spirit's work. We can't control it. We can only position ourselves to receive it.

And isn't that both terrifying and wonderful? Terrifying because we like control. Wonderful because a God who can be fully controlled by human beings isn't much of a God at all. The wild Spirit reminds us that God is always bigger than our plans, always more creative than our imaginations, always more loving than our hearts can fully grasp.

So what does it look like to open ourselves to this wild Spirit in our daily lives? It might mean saying yes to an unexpected invitation to serve. It might mean starting a conversation you've been avoiding. It might mean letting go of your five-year plan and asking God, "What's your plan?" It might mean sitting in silence long enough to hear the wind blow.

John Wesley, our Methodist forefather, experienced this wild Spirit himself. His heart was "strangely warmed" at Aldersgate – not logically convinced, not theologically persuaded, but strangely warmed. There's that beautiful wildness again, working not through the mind alone but through the whole person.

As we move into summer, when schedules loosen and routines shift, perhaps we have a unique opportunity to let the Spirit blow a little more freely through our lives. What might happen if we loosened our grip on control just a bit? What wild and beautiful thing might God do if we stopped trying to direct the wind and simply opened our sails?

Come, Wild Spirit. Blow through our lives, our church, our community. Disrupt what needs disrupting. Ignite what needs igniting. And carry us wherever you please.

A Heart for the Missing

"Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Doesn't he leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost one until he finds it?" – Luke 15:4

Take a moment this Sunday to look around the sanctuary. Notice the faces beside you – but also notice the spaces where familiar faces used to be. The seat where someone once sat faithfully, now empty. The voice that once joined in the hymns, now quiet. The handshake or hug you haven't exchanged in longer than you can remember.

You've noticed. And so has Pastor Brian.

A Call to Reach Out

Pastor Brian is forming a small, dedicated team of approximately **four people** whose mission will be deeply personal and profoundly important: **reconnecting with parishioners who have been absent from worship for an extended period of time.**

This team will reach out to those we've been missing – not with judgment, not with guilt, but with genuine love and concern. The goal is simple and Christ-centered:

1. **To listen** – to understand why they've stepped away
2. **To learn** – whether they've found a church home elsewhere
3. **To invite** – to extend a heartfelt, grace-filled welcome back

Some may have drifted away quietly during a difficult season. Others may have felt unseen or disconnected. Some may be dealing with circumstances we know nothing about. Whatever the reason, they deserve to know that they are **missed, they matter, and there is always a place for them here.**

Is God Stirring Your Heart?

This is not a task for everyone – it's a calling for a few. It requires compassion, sensitivity, humility, and a genuine desire to shepherd others back into fellowship. It requires someone willing to make a phone call that might feel uncomfortable, to knock on a door that hasn't been knocked on in a while, and to say the words so many people long to hear: "We've missed you."

If you've been reading this and feeling a quiet tug – **pay attention to that.** God may be placing this very work on your heart.

Your Next Step

1. **Pray.** Ask God honestly whether this is something He is calling you to.
2. **Reflect.** Consider the faces you've been missing and the love you have to offer.
3. **Respond.** If the answer is yes, please reach out to **Pastor Brian** and let him know you're ready to serve.

The church is not a building. It's a family. And when someone in the family is missing, we don't simply move on – we go and find them. Will you be one of the ones who goes?



The church has been operating under a new system of Leadership. We no longer have an Ad Board but instead a Leadership Team. We have been meeting every month as we learn our responsibilities.

Why, you may ask? It's designed to cut down on the amount of meetings that people need to attend. Currently the people involved on different teams like, worship, nurture, and those managing the facility (Trustees) meet as they are needed. The team leads then sends reports to the Leadership Team. Reports are reviewed and if any action items need approval, the business is handled.

The Leadership Team has dedicated themselves to all aspects of the church to help it grow, the care of the congregation and the building. We spend time in devotions, prayer and discernment as we learn to understand the needs of the church and our understanding of being a leader. The Team recognizes that they need to be growing and leading spiritually by their presence and involvement in church life.

Maybe you have noticed more activities and involvement in the last months such as the Lasagna Dinner, Gym and Game Nights, and Church Breakfast on Sunday morning. We hope that you will want to be a part of the activities as we grow in our desire and care of being a Church Family.

Always at the forefront is our church mission **To know Jesus and make Him known as Savior and Lord.**

Come to the Water: VBS 2026 at St. Andrew's

"Jesus said, 'Come, follow me,' and immediately they left their nets and followed him."
 — Matthew 4:19-20

Something wonderful is stirring at St. Andrew's this June — and it starts at the water's edge.

From Monday, June 22 through Thursday, June 25, our sanctuary, classrooms, and fellowship hall will be transformed into the shores of the Sea of Galilee for "Come to the Water," our 2026 Vacation Bible School. Each afternoon from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m., children from Pre-K through 5th grade will walk alongside Jesus through four of His most beloved lakeside moments:

- Monday — Jesus calms the storm, and we learn He's with us when we're afraid
- Tuesday — Jesus walks on water, and we learn to trust Him when the path feels impossible
- Wednesday — Jesus feeds the 5,000, and we discover He provides more than enough
- Thursday — Jesus calls His first disciples, and we hear His invitation to follow Him too

John Wesley reminded us that faith is never meant to stay in our own hearts — it always "works by love." That's why our VBS children will also be doing real ministry this week. We'll be collecting monetary donations for Clean Water Kenya on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday, helping provide clean drinking water to our neighbors across the world. On Wednesday — the day we remember Jesus multiplying loaves and fish — the children will bring non-perishable food donations for Panther Packs, our backpack ministry feeding local schoolchildren over the weekends.

How You Can Help:

1. **Register a child** (or grandchild, or neighbor!) — forms are available at the church office, in the narthex, or online using this QR Code

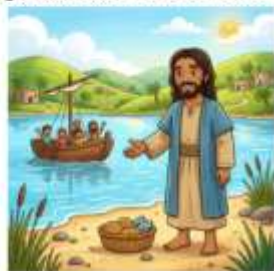


2. **Volunteer** — we need station leaders, craft helpers, snack servers, and greeters
